Conference Officers

President of the Conference: Caela Simmons Wood



Caela is the pastor of First Congregational Church in Manhattan where she has served since 2014. Originally from Kansas and a graduate of K-State, Caela completed a Master of Theological Studies at Perkins School of Theology, Dallas, and a Master of Divinity at Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis. Caela was ordained in 2010 and served as an associate pastor in Bloomington, Indiana before accepting the call to Manhattan and returning to Kansas. Caela is in the NGLI Program (Next Generation Leadership Initiative) of the Pension Board, a leadership program for younger pastors who demonstrate significant potential to build vibrant United Church of Christ congregations. Increasing her leadership capacity with head and heart, Caela is also in a three-year training program called Souljourners to become a Spiritual Director through the Sophia Center in Atchison, Kansas. She has served as Chair of Committee on Ministry D, and noted that she loved serving in that role and stepped down to serve as Vice President of the Conference. Caela served on the Conference Minister Search Committee and has agreed that, if elected, she is ready to become President of the Conference. Caela is married to David and has two sons.

Vice President of the Conference: Jim French



Jim French is a 5th generation farmer and rancher in Reno County, Kansas. He and his wife, Lisa, attend Partridge Community Church-UCC where he has directed the choir since 1980. Before that he received degrees in English Language and Literature and taught at the University of Nebraska. After farming full-time and teaching part time for 25 years, French worked as a Communication Specialist for the Kansas Rural Center, and then as the Senior Advocacy Adviser for Oxfam AmErika. He retired from Oxfam in 2017, and continues to farm and ranch. Most recently, French completed two years of study at the Center for Action and Contemplation Living School.

French grew up attending Partridge Community Church where he currently serves as Moderator and was just starting elementary school when the members voted to merge with the newly established United Church of Christ. He attended camp at White Memorial Camp in the sixties. Member, Finance Stewardship Committee: Joe Pruitt



Member of COM: Kayla Bonewell

Ordained in the United Church of Christ (2010), Kayla served as an associate pastor in Rochester, Minnesota before returning to Oklahoma in 2016 as pastor of Church of the Open Arms and Cathedral of Hope. Kayla has ministry experience as a hospital chaplain, campus minister, social justice activist, youth minister, and associate pastor.

Kayla expressed an initial interest in serving on COM because she believes that supporting the

discernment of those who feel called to ministry is crucial to the future of the church. She agreed to serve another term saying it takes at least two terms to learn the complexity of the COM. Kayla also serves on the Conference Council as the representative of the Committee on Ministry and this year was a General Synod delegate. Kayla serves on COM D. Committee on Ministry Chairs


K-O bylaws state that persons serving as Chairs of the Committee on Ministry are to be elected to the position at Annual Meeting

Gage Church and Erik Graefe, Co-Chairs of Committee A (Authorization and Oversight)



Gage Church is the pastor at Central Congregational Church in Topeka. Gage transferred to K-O from the Rocky Mountain Conference where he served as a member of the Committee on Ministry. With a background in journalism, Gage has the experience of an authorized minister that came to ministry as a second career and found a home in the United Church of Christ. Serving at Central has also given Gage the experience of leading a committed UCC congregation in redefining their ministry after taking a risk in selling a large building that no longer fit the congregation and renting space in Topeka. Gage's experience represents some of the ongoing challenges that many authorized ministers are facing in leading congregations today which makes him an excellent partner to serve as part of the COM leadership team. Erik Graefe: Erik is a licensed minister serving Zion UCC in Junction City. Initially licensed in 2003, Erik was part of the original licensed ministry program in K-O and he served for several years at New Basel UCC before resigning in 2013. Erik worked at K-State with Ecumenical Christian Ministries (ECM) in a number of roles including teaching classes on the Enneagram and taking groups to Standing Rock. Erik also coaches high school basketball at Abilene High School. In 2017, Erik returned to pastoral ministry first as supply pastor and then as a called settled pastor at Zion UCC in Junction City. Erik began serving as Co-Chair of COM A in October 2020 immediately after Annual Meeting following the resignation of the previous Chair. Erik just attended his first General Synod and has also taken the UCC Sacred Conversations to End Racism

(SC2ER) Summer Institute Training. Erik has done a great job and brings the perspective of both a licensed and bi-vocational authorized minister to the COM leadership team. Erik also notes the complexity of COM work and appreciates the team approach. *(Erik is serving his first term on COM A, Class of 2022)*

COM-D (Discernment and Preparation): Rachael Pryor



Rachael Pryor is currently serving as Transitional Minister at Wichita UCC. She also chairs Committee on Ministry D and is eligible to be elected to serve a second term. **Rachael** is likely a name and face many recognize as she has served in various roles in the Conference, most recently as Chair of the Conference Minister Search Committee. Rachael is well suited for the Chair of COM D as she has deep roots in the UCC, experience on the Committee on Ministry and the ongoing evolution of the discernment process in the UCC.
